In 2024, Mercy Hands Europe expanded its reach, scaled up impactful projects, and reinforced its commitment to sustainable humanitarian interventions across Iraq, Syria, Ethiopia, and Gaza.

This year, MHEU focused on key sectors including education, protection, health, emergency response, and livelihoods. By implementing innovative projects, we tackled critical needs like healthcare access, digital literacy, sustainable agriculture, and psychosocial support, creating meaningful and lasting impact for vulnerable communities in Iraq, Syria, Ethiopia, and beyond.

A word from the Executive Director

In 2024, Mercy Hands Europe expanded its impact across Iraq, Syria, and Ethiopia, with projects tripling to address critical needs in education, protection, health, livelihoods, and emergency response. We also extended our support to Syrians and Lebanese during a particularly sensitive historical moment. By scaling up existing initiatives and launching new ones, we continued responding to crises while fostering sustainable development.

1 PROTECTION

PSYCHOSOCIAL AND LEGAL SUPPORT FOR IRAQI AND SYRIAN FAMILIES



North-East Syria and Iraq



Starting date: January 2020

Closing date: Open ended (cases are ongoing)



78 beneficiaries targeted to date



 In partnership with International Social Service (ISS) Switzerland, ISS Germany and Children and Families Across Borders (CFAB)

MHEU (Middle East Humanitarian and Educational Unit) has partnered with ISS Switzerland, ISS Germany, and Children and Families Across Borders (CFAB) to support Iraqi and North East Syrian families facing migration and displacement challenges. We provide social, legal, and psychological assistance to families, especially those affected by violence, abuse, divorce, and mental health issues, through a team of social workers, lawyers, psychologists, and translators.

Our team has expanded to include five social researchers, and we have strengthened our partnership with the "Masar Al-Rahma" Organization, which offers legal and social consultations for complex cases. We also collaborated with a team in Kurdistan, Iraq, to prepare community and police reports in coordination with local authorities.

This year, we received four new adoption cases from CFAB, assessing families nominated for adoption from the UK to Iraq. To date, we have handled over 15 cases, assisting 78 individuals. Additionally, we support Iraqis wishing to return and reintegrate sustainably into society after fleeing conflict.







STRENGTHENING THE CIVIL SOCIETY AND RULE OF LAW IN IRAQ AS A TOOL FOR PEACEBUILDING: PHASE III



Erbil, Iraq & Istanbul, Turkey



Starting date: May 1, 2024 Ending date: October 31, 2024



70 direct beneficiaries



In partnership with Mercy Hands Organization and the Geneva International Centre for Justice

This project, funded by ifa/zivik, established a Network of Stakeholders in Iraq to address Enforced Disappearances (ED) and related human rights violations. Over 70 members, including CSOs, legal professionals, and community leaders, were trained in advocacy, report writing, and legal processes, resulting in 15 comprehensive reports submitted to UN bodies.

The initiative prioritized gender inclusivity, collaboration, and capacity-building, while raising awareness through community engagement and online conferences. Despite security challenges, activities were relocated to Istanbul, ensuring participant safety and sustaining progress. The project successfully enhanced civil society's capacity, advanced legal reforms, and fostered a sustainable framework for long-term human rights advocacy in Iraq.





2 AGRICULTURE & LIVELIHOODS

BEE-COME THE CHANGE



Al-Bab, Al-Bab district, Syria



Starting date: April 1st, 2023 Ending date: May 31st, 2024



100 direct beneficiaries



In partnership with International Agricultural Cooperation Organization

Following the highly successful first year, the second phase of our beekeeping project has been implemented, focusing on three main objectives:

- Addressing the decline in local biodiversity due to the impact of war and chemical pesticides. Proactively, we have initiated the planting of 20,000 seedlings in a specialized greenhouse to rejuvenate and enrich the local ecosystem.
- Promoting independence among our beekeepers by establishing a local queen bee production. Currently reliant on imported queens, we have successfully set up the first queen bee center in Syria, facilitating the cultivation and distribution of local queens, and reducing dependence on external sources.
- Expanding our training program to accommodate an additional 50 beneficiaries, ensuring equal representation with 25 women and 25 men. This expansion aims to provide comprehensive training and equal opportunities for all genders within the beekeeping field.



















WATER, PLANTS AND ANIMALS FOR A SUSTAINABLE ETHIOPIA





Bibugn Woreda, Amhara Region, Ethiopia



Starting date: 1st of May 2023 Ending date: 31st of April 2025



400 direct beneficiaries



In partnership with Agri Service Ethiopia

This project is dedicated to empowering the rural community, with a special focus on women, through a range of income-generating activities. Our initiatives encompass capacity building in beekeeping, poultry practices, ecological agriculture, forestry, and livestock breeding. The core of our interventions is the establishment of incomegenerating agricultural activities and the enhancement of women's decision-making authority.

Additionally, our goal is to alleviate poverty within the community while promoting sustainable agriculture. Finally, we concentrate on health protection by facilitating access to clean water, aiming to reduce both the physical strain on women and the risks of waterborne diseases.











ECO-IRRIGATION & SUSTAINABLE ENTREPRENEURSHIP IN SOUTH OMO





Dassenech Woreda, South Omo Zone, Ethiopia



Starting date: 1st of September 2024 Ending date: 31st of August 2025



100 direct beneficiaries



In partnership with Agri Service Ethiopia

This project's focus shifts to Dassenech Woreda -- a rural community within Ethiopia's South Omo Zone that continues to feel the acute effects of enduring drought and crop failure. As such, the intervention seeks to enhance agricultural sustainability and economic empowerment across local populations.

In doing so, the project sets out to leverage innovative solar-powered irrigation technology, providing beneficiaries the means to become more resilient against climate induced shocks, before providing community members with the knowledge needed to promote climate-smart horticultural practices -- alongside the development market mechanisms for the sale of high potential agricultural commodities.









HIBISCUS, SAFFRON AND GINGER FOR HOLISTIC HEALTH TREATMENT





Domiz 2 Camp, Dohuk, Kurdish Region of Iraq



Starting date: 1 April 2023 Ending date: 30 June 2024



200 direct beneficiaries (Syrian refugees, 50% women)



In partnership with Mercy Hands Organization

This project aims to cultivate hibiscus, saffron and ginger within Domiz 2 refugee camp and produce herbal tea products from them for the community as a holistic natural treatment of various prolific cardiovascular diseases. This is building upon our pilot research project in 2022 demonstrating the power of hibiscus to lower blood pressure, now we will be conducting new medical research on the health impacts of hibiscus and ginger tea on refugees with hypertension and distributing free tea to at least 200 refugees.

This project also involves training nine refugees from the Camp in the cultivation of these plants and production of herbal tea to distribute and sell to members of the local community through a new micro-enterprise. This project will thus address specific health, agriculture and livelihood needs within the region's refugee and IDP population.





3 EDUCATION

DIGITAL LIBRARY SERVICE FOR ETHIOPIAN YOUTH



Hawassa, Sidama Region, Ethiopia



Starting Date: 4th of October, 2024 Ending Date: 2nd of February, 2025



Direct Beneficiaries: 900 youth aged 10-14 Indirect Beneficiaries: 4500 community members



In partnership with Mary Joy Ethiopia

The Digital Library Service project, a collaboration between Mercy Hands Europe (MHEU) and Mary Joy Ethiopia (MJE), addresses the pressing need for accessible digital learning resources in Hawassa, Ethiopia. This initiative aims to enhance education and digital literacy for underserved youth by establishing a fully equipped digital library.

The project focuses on renovating a dedicated library space and outfitting it with essential infrastructure, including desktop computers, internet connectivity, and digital books. Complementary efforts include recruiting trained facilitators, hosting workshops to promote digital skills, and ensuring a safe, inclusive learning environment. By bridging the digital divide, the library will directly benefit 900 young individuals aged 10-24, and indirectly support over 4,500 community members, such as parents and educators.

With a budget of CHF 36,344, the project exemplifies sustainable, scalable community impact. It integrates monitoring, evaluation, and community feedback mechanisms to refine services, ensuring relevance and efficiency.











EMPOWERMENT AND POTENTIAL OF WOMEN AND GIRLS IN ICT AND CODING

Shatt al-Arab District, Governorate of Basra, Iraq

Starting date: 1 October 2024 Ending date: 31 January 2025



220 direct beneficiaries (50,000 people living in the area project)



In cooperation with Mercy Hands Organization

The ICT and Coding Education Initiative, a partnership between Mercy Hands Europe (MHEU) and Mercy Hands for Humanitarian Aid (MH), seeks to bridge the digital divide and empower underprivileged youth in Shatt al-Arab, Basra, Iraq. This project, funded by the Canada Fund for Local Initiatives (CFLI), aims to equip 180 girls aged 12-16, including 30 students with disabilities at local disability institutes, with essential digital skills through comprehensive training in Microsoft Office and Python coding. The initiative also trains 10 local teachers and two institute teachers, ensuring sustainability via a Training-of-Trainers (T.O.T) model.

Complementary activities include field visits to ICT workplaces, community awareness campaigns. With a total of aa least 220 direct beneficiaries and a broader impact on 1,920 individuals, the project emphasizes inclusivity, addressing the barriers faced by girls and youth with disabilities in accessing education and employment. Operating with a budget of approximately \$60000 CAD contributed by CFLI, the project ensures scalability and sustainability through partnerships with local authorities. By fostering digital proficiency and advocating for gender and disability inclusion, this initiative not only enhances individual livelihoods but also contributes to the growth of Iraq's digital economy.







SAFE HAVEN SYRIA



Qabbasin, Al-Bab District, Governorate of Aleppo, Syria



Starting date: 1 October 2024 Ending date: 30 September 2025



250 direct beneficiaries (50,000 people living in the area project)



In cooperation with International Agricultural Cooperation Organization (IACO)

The Safe Haven Syria project seeks to establish a dedicated healthcare centre to serve as a vital support system for women and children in rural areas of Qabbasin, enhancing access to essential healthcare services. Through a combination of physiotherapy interventions and psychosocial support, the centre will provide targeted care to improve the well-being and resilience of local women and children.

Additionally, the centre aims to create a safe and empowering environment where women and children can learn about their rights and gain valuable knowledge on maintaining their health. Educational sessions focused on bullying prevention and violence awareness will further equip them with the tools to recognize and protect themselves against harmful behaviors, fostering a healthier and more informed community.

By building this healthcare center, we strive to make a meaningful, lasting impact on the health and safety of vulnerable populations, aligning with our commitment to supporting their well-being and advocating for their rights.





Financial Overview

In the years leading up to 2024, MHEU's financial journey saw significant transformations. In 2020, the organization relied exclusively on financial support from our sister organization, Mercy Hands Organisation, which generously provided a total of 104,848 CHF to sustain our operations. The following year marked a turning point as we began to secure grants for our projects, boosting our income to 117,042.65 CHF in 2021. A remarkable milestone was achieved in 2022 when MHEU became fully economically self-sustainable, generating a substantial income of 380,137.08 CHF solely through the successful implementation of our projects. Building on this momentum, in 2024, MHEU reached new heights with a total income of 494,709.49 CHF (NB numbers to be approved in the next audit). Here is a breakdown of our income:




Chart 1 - Revenue growth since 2020




Chart 2 - Donations received in 2024



Governance Meetings in 2024

Highlights of these meetings included:

- Reviewing the successes of 2023 and identifying lessons learned.
- Defining and approving the main objectives and priorities for 2024.
- Discussing and approving new projects secured during the year, as well as reviewing the progress of ongoing projects.



- Reflecting on the organizational development of MHEU and exploring ways to enhance its impact and sustainability.
- Approving updated administrative documents and internal policies to uphold good governance and compliance.

These ongoing interactions with the Board of Directors ensured team alignment on common objectives and reinforced a culture of transparency and effective governance.

UNITED NATIONS COMMITTEE ON ENFORCED DISAPPEARANCES







In "Strengthening the Civil Society and Rule of Law in Iraq", phase 3, lessons from previous phases were incorporated to refine the approach and enhance impact. A dynamic group of Iraqi Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and activists was carefully selected, bringing valuable expertise and perspectives.

Participants prepared 10 reports for United Nations (UN) Bodies, including three submitted to the UN Committee on Enforced Disappearances, providing updated insights into Iraq's enforced disappearances. The reports highlighted the lack of significant progress despite the Committee's recommendations, emphasizing the urgent need for action.

A key achievement was establishing direct communication between local organizations and international bodies, especially the UN Committee on Enforced Disappearances, fostering stronger collaboration to address the crisis.





National and International Advocacy

In 2024, we continued our commitment to keeping our valued subscribers informed through our monthly newsletter. This publication provides updates on our ongoing projects, organizational developments, and upcoming events. By releasing a new edition at the start of each month, we aim to maximize our outreach and raise awareness about the impact of our work. 




